Emergency Management of Injured Teeth (EMIT) program is an attempt to create awareness about tooth injury and its management among various school teachers across the country

The objectives of the program are

- i) To assess the knowledge of teachers regarding the first aid measures to be taken during an episode of an injury
- ii) To increase the awareness of immediate management of traumatic/ injured tooth injuries among school teachers and provide the right information to teachers regarding emergency management.


Growing children are more prone to traumatic tooth injuries while playing sports, fights, and accidental falls which can occur at the most inopportune time and place, including the school playground.

Tooth injury can range from small chipping of the front tooth to loosening of the tooth, or the tooth is completely knocked out from the mouth. The chance of the injured tooth being saved is increased manifold if first aid is administered immediately [less than 15 minutes].

The program was launched officially during the second National Conference of the Indian Society of Dental Traumatology on December 19, 2019. The later programs were then initiated through online platforms like Skype, Zoom, or Google meet during this crucial time of the COVID pandemic crisis. The following are the details of the online EMIT programs.





